

Importing Personal Property into Bosnia-Herzegovina



Required Documents:

- Packing List
- Copy of valid passport
- Original inventory list dated, valued and signed by shipper
- Resident or Working permit, or letter from the employer that the client is starting a new contract (Letter of Transfer)
- Invoices for the electrical appliances and for all items bought less than 6 months before the shipment's arrival

If client is a diplomat:

Apply for tax exemption certificate issued by the Bosnian Ministry of Foreign Affairs

If client is not a diplomat:

Must present Bank Guarantee on 39% of the total value of the goods

Importing Motor Vehicles

Must provide the following documents:

- original registration card
- original purchase invoice

Non-diplomats will be assessed taxes and duties in the amount up to 46% of the value of the motor vehicle.

Importing Pets

- Dogs, cats and birds require a health certificate (dated less than 5 days prior to arrival)

Prohibited/Restricted Items

- Firearms, ammunition and illegal drugs.
- Alcohol (must accompanied with the mention of "fond de cave" with less than 30 bottles to be acceptable and duty free.)
